We affirm the United Church of Canada's efforts towards restoring right relations. I am glad to announce tonight that Council's Board of Directors has committed Council to a review of its programming with a view to identifying those human and financial resources that can be allocated to the challenge of reconciliation, and programs through which reconciliation can be fostered."

The 2016 Toronto Waterfront Marathon

Our well-used summer camps require lots of upkeep. Each year there is a need for professional maintenance and construction services in addition to the countless hours put in by volunteers.
