Here are some Highlights of our work in 2016:

With the active support of Council's Centre for Church Development and Leadership, the Living Presence Ministry in East Gwillimbury is strengthening existing congregations and establishing a new form of 'pioneer' ministry in a rapidly expanding community. Read more in

In the **east end of Toronto** a number of congregations have been actively exploring the possibility of a shared future mission. Four of the original six congregations have now voted to move into a transitional phase toward regionalization, sharing staff and resources.

Both of these projects illustrate some of the many ways in which Council has developed strong partnerships with presbyteries, congregations and social ministries over the past year, as well as serving ecumenical partners across Canada. During the year Council staff have worked on major processes with three Toronto Conference Presbyteries, worked on processes with eighteen congregations, and provided consultancy support to three Anglican dioceses, the national Anglican General Synod, as well as a led a visioning process for the Mission to Seafarers.

Council has also helped congregations honour their youth and young adult members. Seven younger church members received Council's Baillie Award for the excellence of their volunteer work at church, school, and within their home communities, bringing to 26

the total number of recipients (from 20 congregations) since the program was initiated in 2014. In the photo below, Logan Carmichael of St. Andrew's United (Markham) receives her award earlier this year.



Nearly \$150,000 has been received and distributed to the five camps with which Council works through the Camping Opportunities
Fund.

The David and Anne Patterson/Toronto
Conference Camping Fund received another contribution, bringing that fund's balance to more than \$1 million. The fund will contribute to camping programs in perpetuity. Read more in the 2015 edition of Council's Partners

Council plays the role of landlord to four children's camps. In October, Council hosted the camps for an interchange session focused on the innovations that are helping our

programs adapt in a quickly changing environment. At that meeting we wished the retiring director of Sparrow Lake Camp, **Rob**Crew goodbye (see photo below). Rob has been a regular fixture at Sparrow Lake all his life.



The Muskoka Housing Fund is a donor advised fund, established through a series of gifts over ten years totalling \$1.7 million. This year the fund made a grant to the District of Muskoka to establish its own program,

Gateway Muskoka, which helps low income, first time homebuyers.

Council's board of directors is undertaking a review of its historical and future program activity supporting the United Church of Canada's commitment to reconciliation with First Nations. The 2016 Heart and Vision Concert recognized two Canadian leaders in this effort, Dr. Marie Wilson and Dr. Roberta Jamieson (see photo below). An article on the concert was published in Insight

Magazine. Next year's event (May 15, 2017) will pick up the same theme when it recognizes the United Church's first moderator of First Nation's ancestry, **Dr. Stanley McKay** and the Executive Director of First Nations Child and Family Caring Society of Canada, **Dr. Cindy Blackstock.**
